Manager's Notes...

Today is the final match of the 2023-24 season and we welcome Bridgwater to the AJN Stadium.

Not quite the local derby that Portishead can provide, or that Larkhall used to offer before their demise, but still one of only three FA Women's National League teams in Somerset.

The season has been positive in many ways. We have had a really great Adobe Women's FA Cup run and of course, we recaptured the Somerset Senior Cup with a 4-0 triumph over Yeovil Town, for the first time in almost five years and cemented our position as the club with the most Final wins in that competition. You can see more information provided by Neil Brown at Women's Soccer Scene elsewhere in this programme.



Nevertheless, having stabilised the club after the rather unfair relegation from the Southern Premier to tier four, we have made overall progress this season and are preparing to mount a serious attack on the top league positions next season. We already have three quality potential signings lined up for the 2024-25 season. We understand that this new season will kick off on Sunday 18th August.

There are also positives amongst the coaching staff, where our long search for an experienced female coach ended with Avril Cooke joining the senior club to great effect. We will have additional coaching resources next season with Mark Graham joining. Both he and Avril are UEFA 'B' qualified. We also anticipate Asheley Wade collecting his 'C' licence in the next couple of months.

We are also very close to completing partnership arrangements with two significant development clubs in time for them to make a major impact on next season.

Improving the players already here is very important and it is great to learn that our goalkeeper, Charlotte Haynes, has been selected for an award next week at the FAWNL awards event. A positive recognition for Charlie and for Keynsham Town LFC.

Our Reserve team has had a tough season in the Reserve section of the FAWNL, but much was down to several opponents fielding half their first teams which is not in the spirit of the competition. The Reserve division is supposed to develop young players, not to arrange games so that you tilt the balance to win.

Next season we expect to have a much stronger and aspirational squad in this team. We have also got permission to affiliate as Keynsham Town Development rather than Reserves to reflect the importance of a pathway.

If one looks at the negatives of the past season, the resignation of all of the previous management committee and their replacement by FA staff has to be one. This has led to less empathy with clubs like us than previously existed and a mushrooming of tasks and paperwork that is beyond the capabilities of most clubs that rely upon volunteers. That trend will only get worse as member club views appear alien to the FA.

So, it just remains for me to trust that we all see an entertaining match this afternoon.

Secretary's Views...

Congratulations to our players on winning the County Women's Senior Cup and to our supporters who came along to watch.

Last Sunday we were due to play Abingdon away, the team were on the bus on their way, when one of our players called querying if the game was on - she'd received a text from a player in France that according to Abingdon's social media the game was off. We had to ring Abingdon to confirm this. Without warning us they'd sent photos of a waterlogged pitch to the match referee, who called the game off on the basis of that. However they did not see fit to tell us! Pure chance we found out before we actually arrived.

As a consequence the League said the game had to be rescheduled and insisted if we could not fit it in before Friday, then under League rules, we would be made to play on Friday night and if we didn't we would be charged with a possible fine of £250. We polled our players and at short notice, with work commitments, too few players were available and we had no transport. Only 4 players could play on Friday and we felt as a safeguarding and player welfare issue our players should not play Friday and again today. There was no question of it affecting relegation or promotion so we declined to go. We have now been charged. I have 7 days to respond.

The season finishes but it is a busy time making sure team and club officials have all their qualifications and safeguarding up to date with a new obligatory Player Welfare in Open Age Football course, which we must all undertake before we can affiliate. We also have exciting plans behind the scenes which we hope to have in place for next season.

Thank you for your support. Have a good Summer and we look forward to welcoming you back next season.

At the AJN Today ...

Bridgwater United Women F.C.

The team was formed by Tony Baverstock as Yetminster Ladies, and originally competed in South West League Division Two, the club's first game was against Weymouth Vikings on 16 September 1990. The club was renamed Sherborne Ladies in 1993, and in 1997 the team reached the 4th Round of the Women's FA Cup, finally going out to Everton in front of a crowd of over 500 at Huish Park. The team was renamed Yeovil Town Ladies in 1999, and progressed well under the management of John Flatters. After Flatters departed the club, first team coach Steve Phelps took over.



The club embarked upon its first season back up in the South West Combination in 2007–08. It was another good campaign too, with the team acclimatising well to their new status and gaining a very respectable fourth-place finish. The 2008–09 season again saw fine progress, Yeovil Town footballer Nathan Jones joined as first team coach in November 2009. Yeovil finished the season third, behind league champions Queens Park Rangers and second place Plymouth Argyle. The Reserves finished the season as League champions, gaining promotion to the South West League, Division One.

The following season was disrupted by poor weather for almost four months, but this allowed the team to concentrate on the FA Cup, with victories over Saltash United, Forest Green Rovers and Newquay taking them to an exciting fourth round tie with Norwich City, a game that saw them come out 3–0 winners, setting up a tie with Nottingham Forest. They lost this narrowly 1–0, but clearly showed their higher league promise. The team won the South West Combination Women's League, having won seventeen, drawn one and lost just two of their twenty matches, scoring 103 goals, conceding just fifteen. The 2011–12 season was the first full season under the tenure of the new joint first team managers Nigel Williams and Sarah Lawler and saw two trophies won by the senior squad, with the lifting of both the South West Women's Combination Football League Trophy and the Somerset FA Women's Senior Cup.

The 2012–13 season saw the club finish 3rd in the Premier League Southern Division, their highest ever finishing position, and reached the 5th round of the FA Women's Cup before losing 4–0 to Leeds United. In April 2013, it was confirmed that the club had been accepted in to the new expanded FA WSL Division 2. The 2016 season saw Yeovil win promotion to FA WSL 1, winning the WSL Division 2 title.

Their entry into the top flight of English women's football came during the 2017 spring series, a series created to shift women's football calendar from a summer to a winter league. While they finished last in the spring series, this series saw no promotion or relegation before the 2017–2018 season which started in September 2017.[6] They subsequently finished last during this 2017–18 season but remained in the FA WSL through the FA club licensing application process. In March 2019, the club was reported to have entered administration. They were deducted 10 points during the 2018–19 season, finishing 15 points adrift and getting relegated. However, in May 2019, they were denied an operating licence for the Championship and would have to contest the following season as a third tier club instead.

In March 2021, Yeovil United merged with men's club Bridgwater Town, forming Bridgwater United. In April 2023, following a 4–0 defeat at London Bees, Bridgwater United Women were relegated from the Southern Premier Division of the FA Women's National League to Division One South West.

Keynsham add to Cup record

Keynsham Town 4 Yeovil Town 0

Keynsham Town lifted the Somerset FA Cup Senior Women's Cup for the first time in five years after proving too strong for a valiant Yeovil Town side at Paulton.

Three first half goals put the FAWNL firmly in control of the match and a late strike put the gloss on the night for them and brought Yeovil's hopes of a trophy treble to an end, whilst Keynsham extended their record of winning the competition more times than any other team.

Keynsham pressed from the start and almost went ahead in the third minute when Brooke Stirrup broke through and rounded Emily Hall but the angle was just too acute and her shot went into the side netting. Keynsham were dominating the early possession but Yeovil were to have the next chance, Charlotte Haynes coming off her line to block a shot from Niamh Nicholls after she got in behind the defence.

Yeovil were finding it hard to come to terms with Keynsham's passing and movement at this stage though and the pressure finally told in the tenth minute. Hall's attempts to punch clear a corner cannoned back off a team mate and against the bar and, whilst trying to clear under pressure, Chloe Davenport diverted the ball into her own net.

Another corner led to Keynsham going two up, this time Stirrup was on hand to tuck the ball home from six yards out.

Vicky Vipond was inches away from making it three and the dominant Jade Radburn shot over but with half time approaching, Stirrup was brought down by Becky Miles and although the challenge looked to be fractionally outside the area, a penalty was awarded and Naomi Clipston stepped up to make no mistake from the spot.

The strong running of Clipston had been a constant threat in the first half and following a good turn in the area, she crashed a shot against the bar. Hannah Price could not quite force home the rebound and Vipond was on hand but also hit the bar.

The second half saw Yeovil come out in determined fashion and they were able to push further forward as they attempted to retrieve something from the game. They won a series of corners but could not seriously threaten Haynes in the Keynsham goal as her defence stood firm in front of her, with Celyn Garton winning a number of headers.

As a result, Keynsham chances were much fewer after the break as well although Vipond went close after latching onto a Clipston pass, the in-form striker poking her shot inches past the post. Alex Walsh did get the ball in the net before an offside flag ruled her effort out and Lily Reed fired a long range shot inches over the bar. Full back Lily Withers then threatened to score a solo effort with a run which took her into the area before she was finally crowded out.

Yeovil, who fielded six players aged 18 or under on the night, were looking a lot stronger after the break with their defence being well marshalled by the experienced Emma Brazell, well supported by Abbie Vernon. Hall was having an impressive match in goal and her handling was faultless when tested by a number of Keynsham corners during the second half.

There was nothing Hall could do though in injury time as Keynsham rounded off their night with a fourth and final goal. After Vipond had been fouled just outside the area, Radburn crowned a fine personal display by drilling a shot into the corner of the net and start off the celebrations for her side.
