Manager's Notes...

Today we have two FA Women's National League fixtures.

First, there is a Reserve division game against Swindon Town Reserves. We trust that there will not be an instance of a Reserve team fielding several First team players against our Reserves, which has been an unwelcome feature of several reserve games against our Reserve side, a matter that we will be raising at the next AGM.

Our second game is the First team match against Moneyfields and we hope that both today's visitors will have travelled safely to the AJN Stadium this afternoon.

Moneyfields have had a very good season so far and sit in fourth place in the league table with 26 points, three more than ourselves.

Our away trip there earlier in the season resulted in our biggest defeat of the competition, when we lost 8-0, with a weakened side and player numbers that were further reduced when Issy Amphlett broke her wrist and had to leave the field of play. Let's hope for a considerable improvement on that scoreline today and a much more even game.

Last Sunday saw us overcome Portishead Town in the County Cup Semi Final. Goals came from Justine Lorton, Naomi Clipston, Brooke Stirrup and Vick Vipond (2). We now will proress to the final which is being held at Paulton Rovers FC on Thursday 4th April with a 7.30pm kick off. Our opponents will be Yeovil Town, which won 8-0 against Middlezoy. It appears that somehow, we may have to change our colours on this occasion, so our away kit of Orange and Lemon is on standby in case that is forced upon us.

It appears that our away fixture at Bournemouth is likely to be at Dean Court and that 4,500 tickets may have already been sold. Time will tell if this is true.

Friday evening saw both our U15 teams in action as our second placed side took on our third placed Panthers side, winning 5-1 on the night and moving to the top of the division. A good performance from both teams. The key deciding match will be at Portishead on the 24th of March, that will decide the league winners.

At the AIN Today ...

Moneyfields Ladies F.C.

Since launching the team in 2017, Portsmouth-based Moneyfields FC Women have climbed the women's football pyramid with successive promotions through the Hampshire FA Women's Leagues and the Southern Region Women's Leagues.

In May 2022, after two seasons lost to COVID, they finally secured a much-deserved promotion into the FA Women's National League South West Division One, the fourth tier of women's football.



The team's first season in the National League was a huge success, the team finished in the top three, above established sides like Southampton Women and Swindon Town. Outside of league action, the team made history by reaching the First Round proper of the Vitality Women's FA Cup — this season that record was broken on three occasions.

Moneyfields have been on fire in front of goal this season, being the first National League team across the six divisions to score fifty goals in the 2023-24 season. Captain Charley Wilson-Wilton (16) and Kau'inohea Taylor (15) top the club's goal scoring charts.

Being a fourth tier side, Moneyfields entered the FA Cup in the third qualifying round where they overcame Gloucester City with a 4-0 win. Kim Fuller opened the scoring in the fifteenth minute. Followed by a brace from Gemma Simmonds either side of half time. While Amelia Hammond rounded off the scoring on her first team debut.

In the First Round, victory against Ashford Town was hard fought as Moneyfields were forced to come from behind twice after Town's Ashley Cheatley put the visitors ahead 2-1 at half time. Moneyfields rallied and got the all-important equaliser through Gemma Simmonds three minutes into the second half. Five minutes later Sophie Phelps scored a wonderful third goal to put Moneys ahead. The centre-back, on her first appearance since returning to the club, picked up the ball in the centre circle and burst forward to play a one-two with centre forward Kau'inohea Taylor, upon receiving the return Phelps found herself through on goal and finished well past the Town keeper. Goals from Charley Wilson-Wilton, Kau'inohea Taylor and Kim Fuller wrapped up the victory.

Two weeks later, Moneyfields travelled to Haringey Borough, a team from the tier below. Kim Fuller settled any early nerves with a twelfth minute goal. Her first time shot, from a superb pass from Sharna Capel Watson gave the opposition keeper no chance. Boro's young team did not let their heads drop and were a constant threat with explosive pace in the wide areas. Their hard work was rewarded when they drew level. Charley Wilson-Wilton gave Moneyfields a 2-1 lead just before half time and provided a bit of breathing room with a third just before the hour mark which sealed the victory.

Moneyfields' prize was a home tie against Millwall Lionesses, another side from the league below. The match was a tight affair and was settled by a first half goal from Kau'inohea Taylor.

The run came to an end in the Fourth Round when they were beaten by London City Lionesses but the club can be proud of its best ever performance in the competition to date.

Let Girls Play session a success

To coincide with International Women's Day on Friday 8 March, a record-breaking 465,000 girls from 5,000 schools across England took part in The FA and Barclays' third Biggest Ever Football Session, as part of the Let Girls Play campaign.

This year, the Biggest Ever Football Session has seen more registrations than ever before, with 71% of the schools who have signed up having never done so before, highlighting the evergrowing demand for girls to play football. 76% of schools who have taken part in the previous sessions have stated the activity has influenced equal access in their school.

The sessions taking place up and down the country mark a year to the day since the UK Government committed to unlocking equal opportunities for girls to play sports including football in their schools.

The transformational change was backed by a multi-million-pound investment in school sport and afterschool activities – including over £600 million in funding over the next two academic years for the PE and Sport Premium. The commitment to increase participation was delivered thanks to campaigning spearheaded by the EURO 2022-winning Lionesses and an open letter they addressed to prospective Prime Ministers Rishi Sunak and Liz Truss which looked to increase the chance for girls to play the game in school with participation at only 63% in 2022.

Attending a London event to celebrate the sessions is England and Arsenal defender Lotte Wubben-Moy, who returns to Olga Primary School in Bow where she set up its very first girls' team as a student with former teacher Paul Cox. Wubben-Moy was part of England's EURO 2022 winning squad and actively campaigned for all young girls to be given the opportunity to play football in school.

Lotte was joined in Bow by former England International and Barclays ambassador Kelly Smith along with football freestyler Lia Lewis Gribius, where they met girls taking part in a training session and saw a mural unveiled, inspired by Wubben-Moy's 'doodle diary' in the tournament winning summer of 2022 and during the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup.

This year students with special educational needs and disabilities at Westcroft School in Wolverhampton were joined on the day by Honorary President of UK Deaf Sport and star of the TV show Gladiators', Jodie Ounsley AKA 'Fury'. Jodie was fitted with a cochlear implant aged 15 and faced barriers to sports with physical contact due to her hearing impairment, however continued to ask questions and push boundaries on what is being offered to those with a disability.

England senior women's player Lotte Wubben-Moy said: "It is both a special and fitting moment to be back at my primary school - where I was once the only girl playing football - on a day where 465,000 girls from primary and secondary schools across the country will be part of the Biggest Ever Football session.

"When we won the EUROS, we as Lionesses wanted to leave a tangible legacy. Almost two years on that legacy is coming to fruition, with young girls who want to play football at school benefiting most.

"As the game grows, especially at the elite level, it's increasingly important that grassroots teams and schools are not left behind. Every girl in this country should know that if they want to play football, they can."
