Manager's Notes...

We complete our tough run of successive fixtures with today's match against Exeter. The run has included away trips to Swindon (where we just had a real off day) and the magnificent performance at Bournemouth, where we graced the Vitality Stadium by being only the second team to take a point from Bournemouth. Apparently, they were told they could have just two home games at the Premier League ground and selected the fixtures against Portishead and ourselves, being teams they presumed they could demolish and look good in front of a big crowd of supporters. It worked in the game against Portishead, which ended 4-0 and looking at our outcome at Swindon, they anticipated a 6 or 7 goal run away victory in front of the 6,500 spectators. It was a great day out for us and we shocked them by taking a 1-0 lead in the 20th minute. Bournemouth huffed and puffed and did we have to defend in the second half, not equalising until the 80th minute and then failing to make any more progress as the referee played 9 minutes of mystery 'injury' time.

The race for promotion to Tier 3 between Exeter and Bournemouth is going right to the wire with the last game on May 5th when they play each other for the second time. I always think it is better to have the points rather than the games in hand as the catch up in the last few games of the season can be a period of intense pressure. Today's game will give us a good guide to their relative qualities. Whichever



team comes second will be highly disappointed being faced with another season in Tier 4.

It was disappointing to find that our Senior County Cup Final was postponed on Thursday against Yeovil. It was, however, not a surprise. Paulton Rovers ground is not the best pitch, although the infrastructure is fine and the persistent rain last week was too much for the pitch to cope with. There is no indication yet as to the replacement date. I guess it will again be at Paulton, probably in a week or two and probably again on a Thursday evening.

** STOP PRESS ** Since these notes were written, we have received confirmation from the Somerset FA will now be played on Thursday 25 April (7.30pm), again at Paulton.

Many will have caught up with the news that Mia Daly has been unable to complete the season and could not get an extension to her visa and so has flown home. Mia has an effervescent personality and has been a big influence in our defence, especially in recent weeks. She will be missed, but hopes to return to Keynsham at some time in the future. She has also been important in editing our match day programme; a task that now falls back to myself for the remaining three home fixtures this season.

It just remains for me to wish all supporters a flowing and entertaining game this afternoon. Our next home match is next Sunday, 14th April, when Abingdon Utd are our visitors.

Women's football in Taiwan

Taiwan has recently been in the news because of a terrible earthquake, despite its history for its effective anti earthquake building expertise. Its position in world football for women is less well known.

The Chinese Taipei women's national football team represents Taiwan (the Republic of China) in international women's football and is controlled by the Chinese Taipei Football Association, the governing body for football in Taiwan.

The Chinese Taipei women's national football team has been known or nicknamed as "Mulan". The nickname was adopted by the national federation during the tenure of then-chairman General ChengWei-yuan in 1975 after the Chinese folk heroine Hua Mulan. After the CTFA adopted a new logo featuring a Formosan blue magpie in the 2010s, the Blue Magpies has also been used as an unofficial moniker.

The team play In an all blue kit at home and an all white away kit. The side are ranked 40 in the FIFA International List of Countries and to put that into a UK context, Wales are ranked 32 and Nortern Ireland at 46. Taiwan is ofter overshadowed by its much larger China (ChinaPR) which has a FIFA ranking of 15 at present.

Taiwan was a very early adopter of women's football in the modern era and Taiwan became one of the unheralded giants of Asian women's football from the late 1970s to the late 1990s.

After the Mulan were formed in the mid-1970s, the Taiwanese went on to become three-time Asian Cup champions between 1977 and 1981, and finished no Due to its dominance, Chinese Taipei was one of just three Asian teams to qualify for the first-ever Women's World Cup in 1991, joining Japan and hosts China. They finished third in their four-team group after defeating Nigeria 2-0 on the final match day, and made it through to the quarter-final where they lost to eventual winners USA, finishing 8th overall.

The female player's burden...

1 in 19 females playing soccer rupture their ACL, making it a well-known burden to the population. Over the years, there has been a significant increase in ACL surgeries done on female varsiy and adolescent athletes, which could potentially exceed \$650 million annually. Despite this, surgery is still seen as a more cost-effective option than non-operative physical therapy treatment. The effectiveness of surgical vs. non-operative treatment regarding post-traumatic osteoarthritis as well as patient reported knee scores is still lacking. Additionally, female soccer athletes have increased rates of graft tear and contralateral ACL tear compared with similar non-soccer athletes. This could be due to athletes not reaching baseline joint health or function before returning, and has led to suggestions of extending the typical return to play from 9-12 months to 2 years. Although this may be a safer option, it does not gain back lost time from sport for athletes.

Developing early-onset osteoarthritis (OA) is a debilitating long-term consequence of ACL injuries. A follow up study done 12 years post-ACL injury on women soccer players showed 51% of subjects presented OA while 82% showed signs of developing OA. OA has also been associated with significantly poorer quality of life when compared to healthy individuals. Individuals with OA reported increased incidences of pain, low energy levels, poor physical mobility, poor sleep, and poor emotional reaction1. The prevalence of this injury and high stakes that it presents has led researchers to study mechanisms that may challenge the ACL's integrity as well as identify the common factors in females, however, mechanisms have not been clearly defined for specific populations.

Risk Factors of ACL Injury in Female Soccer Players

It is established in the literature that females tend to suffer from ACL injuries more frequently than their male counterparts4, facing a 2- to 10-fold increased risk. Biomechanical profile related to injury risk has manifested as early as pre-pubertal stages in females. This is likely due not only to external movement factors such as weather, type and condition of playing surface, and footwea8, but also intrinsic factors that tend to differ between sexes.

Women tend to have a higher body mass index (BMI) than males, meaning they have more weight distributed over a given height. A higher-than-normal BMI has been associated with increased risk of injury due to potentially causing higher ground reaction forces (GRF). Sex-specific hormones and the menstrual cycle are also theorised to affect injury risk, with some research showing increased risks in postmenarche groups. Evidence suggesting that sex hormones cyclically increase knee laxity, which may predispose the ACL to a stretched state. Their research also suggests that more injuries occur immediately following menstruation and just before ovulation, however more recent literature does not support this claim. Analysis of several studies found them difficult to compare due to inconsistencies in defining cycle phase categorisation and different measurement techniques, ultimately concluding that more research is needed in this area. Furthermore, females are reported as predisposed due to anatomical disadvantages including decreased intercondylar

femoral notch size, increased posterior slope of the tibial plateau, anterior-posterior knee laxity, and several others.

Conclusion

Lower extremity musculoskeletal injuries are a lingering threat to all female soccer athletes. The unpredictable, fast pace of the game paired with sex-specific disadvantages frequently lead to unwanted mechanics that tend to cause injury. Although this population faces several common injuries, it seems the ACL injury is one of the most detrimental in terms of need for surgery, return-to-play time, and longterm joint health. Based on current knowledge, there is a lack of understanding regarding ACL injury risk specifically in female soccer athletes, a rapidly developing population.

There appears to be a lack of population-specific research making it difficult to conclude specific kinematic, kinetic, and muscle activation patterns for female soccer athletes. The contribution of several kinematic and kinetic mechanisms as well as muscle activation patterns to ACL injury risk have not been solidified in the literature, making it difficult to apply these results to specific populations. Additionally, there is a clear need to develop more specific prevention programs for female soccer athletes, which may be able to produce positive results and potentially boost compliance.

ACL injury risk for female soccer athletes should be closer examined so that more specific injury risks can be established, and effective protective measures can be taken. Raised awareness of this need may capture attention in the research and medical communities, potentially stimulating research and thus, the development of strategies that limit future ACL injury and thus the challenges it brings to the high-risk female soccer athlete.


